## A Delightful Trip Back in Time — Claudia Hine

wasn't expecting company when my doorbell rang in late March. I opened the door to a woman I didn't recognize who told me, "I used to live in this house." I was thrilled. Since moving into our century-old house in Old Irving 25 years ago, my husband T. J. and I have wished to connect with someone from its long ago past.

Mary Alice Smith (nee Burns) and her husband Lee live in Janesville, Wisconsin. They have been taking long drives in the time of Covid to get out of the house. Mary

decided they should come to her old neighborhood and visit the area where she lived until 1958. Much has changed, of course, but our house on Keeler Ave. is situated between St. Viator Church and Schurz High School, landmarks she remembered well.

It may have shocked her when I began to pull out U.S. Census records dating back to 1900 that I had collected from Ancestry. I had done some research about Mary's family as her great-great grandfather, Edward Offley Bayliss, a carpenter, built our house.

Thanks to a Tier II research grant from the Irving Park Historical Society, we know quite a bit about our house. Edward Bayliss purchased the lot in September 1888. He and his wife, Johanna, took out a mortgage on the property in January 1890 to build the house that year.

## Who Is Edward Bayliss?

Edward O. Bayliss was born in April 1845 in Penn, Staffordshire, England. The son of William Bayliss, a carpenter, and Ann Bayliss, Edward remained in England through his late twenties, working as a carpenter with his father. He married in 1875 (name of bride unknown, but possibly Alice) and had a son, Edward O. Bayliss Jr. in November 1877.

Bayliss and his son immigrated to the U.S. in 1880. (It is likely his wife died before they left England.) In 1885, he married Joanna, who had come to the U.S. from Sweden three years before. They settled along Milwaukee Ave. south of Lawrence until the completion of their new home.

#### A House History

The Bayliss House is an example of the Stick style, a transitional style dating from 1860 through 1890, between the preceding Gothic Revival style and the subsequent Queen Anne style. Stick style buildings are Gothic in their overall verticality but look toward the Queen Anne style in their picturesque complexity, both in form and detailing. Characteristic of this style are gable and cross-gable roofs with decorative trusses in the apex of the gable peaks. Wood wall surfaces are decorated with patterns of vertical or diagonal boards. Porches commonly show diagonal or curved braces.

The Bayliss House is a restrained iteration of the Stick style, which is appropriate for the overall residential character of the block and in keeping with the middle-

class background of its builder and owner. The roofline itself is complex, with a small front-facing gable peak extending the top of the hipped roof, and multiple gable-roof bays on the front and side elevations. The geometric design on the front and side gable walls, consisting of vertical and diagonal wood boards and triangular shingles, is the defining feature of the Stickstyle house.

## **A Growing Family**

Sometime around 1900, the home was converted into a multi-family residence and the Bayliss family began renting out the second floor apartment. In April 1910, Edward Jr. married Lottie Hardina and the young couple moved into the rental unit after their wedding.

Edward and Johanna stayed in the home for the remainder of their lives. Johanna died in 1911, and in the years after his wife's death, Bayliss transferred ownership to Edward Jr. and lived with his son, daughter-in-law, and their twin daughters, Alice and Clara (Mary's mother), who were born in December 1910. When Clara married Robert Burns, the couple took the upstairs unit, and that's where Mary lived until the family moved in 1958.

After a delightful chat, we promised to share additional information, and soon thereafter, I received the accompanying photos circa 1911. I sent her all the Ancestry documents I had, and we promised to meet again one day. I can't wait to share the old books we have from the 1890s, signed by her ancestors.





## When to Call 311 vs. 911

Call 911 while the incident you are reporting is in progress and the on-site presence of a police officer is necessary to help resolve the matter (e.g., burglary in progress, incident involving injuries, quieting loud neighbors, etc.). You should contact 311 if the incident you are reporting has occurred and the offender is gone from the scene.

Use 311 to find information, request non-emergency services, or report non-emergency issues. You can call 311 to find out what Police District and beat you live in, as well as the date, time and location of your next beat meeting. Contacting 311 gives you easy access to non-emergency police services, from filing police reports to talking to police personnel in your district.


